Three H'ton women art exhibit winners

Huntington artists Beverly Figelman, Connie Legakis
and Catherine MacDonald
have taken top prizes in the
Huntington Township Art
League's 34th Annual Long
Island Artists Exhibition,
co-sponsored by the
Heckscher Museum.

Figelman, a resident of East Northport, was awarded two prizes for her monoprint titled "Wedge/Cor-Ten Series." For the Don Stewart Graphic Award, she received \$350 and another \$100 for the Heckscher Museum Award.

Legakis of Cold Spring Harbor was recognized with an Award of Excellence and \$375 for her pencil drawing "Reflections, Cold Spring Harbor." Huntington resident MacDonald's mixed media-monoprint called "Surfside," was also singled out for a \$375 Award of Excellence.

The 34th Annual Long

Island Artists Exhibition remains on view at the Heckscher Museum through June 11. The museum, located on Prime Avenue in Huntington, is open Tuesday through Friday from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. and on Saturday and Sunday from 1 to 5 p.m. Admission is free.

Co-sponsored by the Huntington Township Arts League and the Heckscher Museum, the 34th Annual Long Island Artists Exhibition opened at a reception on May 12 with the announcement of prizes for 14 local artists. Donald Kuspit of State University at Stony Brook and Barbara Ingber of the Ingber Gallery in New York City were judges.

Beverly Figelman of East Northport received two prizes: The Donn Steward Graphic Award and the Heckscher Museum Award. Awards of Excellence were granted to Connie Legakis of Cold Spring Harbor, Catherine MacDonald of Huntington and Rhea Vadher of Port Jefferson. Jo-Anne Wilson of East Setauket received the Gladys Service Award. Recognition in the form of memberships to HTAL and the Heckscher Museum was granted to the work of Ellen County of East Setauket and Jim Fletcher of West Islip.
